## TARGET AUDIENCE

English speaking citizens of Caribbean OAS member states

Public officials, policy makers, civil society representatives, public tech entrepreneurs and private sector participants with a position to influence and become agents of change for the promotion of open government principles and practices in their institutions and communities.

The training includes lectures, workshops, presentations and group discussions related to the implementation of open government strategies and practices.

## METHODOLOGY

Practical tools and methodologies will be provided for the design, development and implementation of open government strategies, practices and commitments.

Speakers will present each subject and will set the agenda and bibliography for each session.

There will be opportunities to hear from open government practitioners who will share their experiences through presentations, workshops and round tables.

Student's participation, critical analysis, group discussions, exchange of experiences among participants will be encouraged.

Teams will be established as working groups to develop a final project to be presented at the last session. This project will entail to develop a tangible solution through open government commitments to address a specific challenge in their country, institution or community.

## Application Requirements

- Citizenship of a Caribbean OAS Member State.
- Updated Curriculum Vitae
- One letter from the institution where the candidate works stating that the program will be beneficial to the institution.
- One letter in which the participant explains why he/she is a good candidate and how the program will have an impact on his/her institution or community (300 words).
